


The provided image is a bar graph which illustrates the sales of wines. This graph addresses many types of wines: Marriott, Riesling, Semillon, Shiraz, and Sparkling wines. The information is presented in four distinct formats: ACT, NSW, QLD, and VIC. Overall, ACT has the most significant wine sales of any state, whereas NSW has the lowest. Moreover, Marriott wine sales were consistently above 25,000 dollars. In contrast, the sales of Riesling were the lowest of the five wines.
